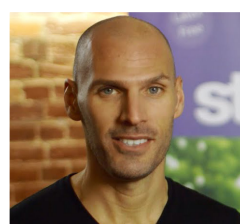

NOTABLE ALUMNI

The School Games National Finals has seen many of its athletes go on to achieve on the national and international stage.

Inspirational athletes including **Dina Asher-Smith**, **Adam Peaty** and **Hannah Cockcroft** represented Team GB at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

265 School Games National Finals alumni represented the Home Nations at Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. They secured **100** medals that include 31 golds, 35 silvers and 34 bronzes placing them **3rd** if they were all to compete as a nation in the medal table.

Medallists included Katarina Johnson-Thompson (England), Hannah Cockcroft (England), Adam Peaty (England), Eilish McColgan (Scotland), Olivia Breen (Wales) and Bethany Firth (Northern Ireland).

We are extremely proud of our alumni and look forward to adding this year's athletes to the ever growing list!

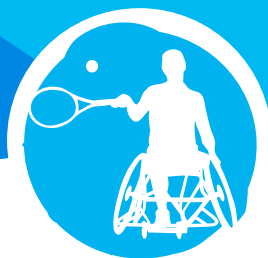

Underpinning the theme of athlete wellbeing, there will also be a focus on **'building belonging'** as we see a return of the athletes lounge and more opportunities for athletes to connect socially across sports.

The athlete education programme will support the athletes at the games from the point of selection via pre-games engagements through newsletter communications right through to competing at Loughborough University to help them embed their learning post games.

The Athlete Education Programme during the games will feature:

- **A live keynote** on the Thursday evening bringing together athletes across sports for the launch of their education experience at the games;
- **The opportunity to engage with Athlete Mentors** who have been specifically appointed for each sport to work with the Team Managers to ensure a great Games experience for all young athletes and to provide education and learning opportunities throughout the event;
- **A live opening ceremony** on the Friday evening of the games that celebrates everything that the School Games National Finals are all about;
- **An athlete lounge** designed to offer athletes the chance to relax out of competition time and access educational content from experts in sport;
- **Opportunities to engage with partners** such as Loughborough University and UKAD to access their clean sport education programmes.
